










lk, mule deer and moose antlers are shed naturally every year and are collected to create the organic chandeliers which have become synonymous with fine western interiors. The three eight-foot wide elk antler chandeliers in the Bighorn Lodge's Great Room are the largest ever constructed in Jackson Hole. In Wyoming, scale is spectacular and style is unapologetically extravagant, but never stuffy. Inside and outside of the two National Parks near Jackson Hole (Yellowstone and Grand Teton) nature remains untamed and her noble beasts still roam freely. Bison, wolves, elk, moose, deer, bear, and wild horses, as well as a number of smaller creatures, can be found near The Bighorn Lodge.
